## **GFWC Techie's Tips: Why Aren't Club Members Seeing Facebook Posts?**

You're eating lunch with a fellow club member who asks if you've seen the #ThrowbackThursday post GFWC posted an hour ago. You pull up Facebook on your phone, but the post doesn't seem to be on your feed, even when you scroll. Both you and your friend like the GFWC Facebook page, so why wouldn't you both see it? Facebook algorithms can affect what posts are visible.

When you go to the [GFWC Facebook page](#), you'll see a "Following" button at the top. Click on it to see your options!

**Default Follow:** when you "like" a page on Facebook, it automatically gets you to "follow" it. This means updates from that page will appear on your News Feed.

**See First:** this brings GFWC's posts to the top of your News Feed so you'll never miss them.

### A BIG “THANK YOU” TO SEW KIND CHAIRMAN, VENITA BAKER

16 years ago, in 2003, club members Venita Baker and Aileen Baker (same last name, but not related) started what was known as the Sewing Group. It was just the two of them at first but, as months passed, more members and many friends joined in their mission of charitable sewing. This monthly workshop has always been a great way to demonstrate what we do as a club and, as a result, we’ve gained many new club members after they saw the sewing group ‘in action.’

Since the beginning, the sewing group has created items for the *Paul Newman Painted Turtle Camp*, such as blankets, bed quilts and turtle pillows. As time went on, the variety of their sewing projects grew. And, from time to time, other club chairmen would request help with sewing specific items for other projects – toiletry bags for veterans; Christmas stockings for foster children; arm splints for young patients after surgery; the list goes on. Although it’d be difficult to tally the exact number of items sewn since 2003, we do know that **in 2018, this group of dedicated sewers created an amazing 2,206 separate items!** Every single one was donated to deserving charities, local and abroad. The group is now known as **Sew Kind** and Yorba Linda Woman’s Club couldn’t be prouder, or more appreciative, of the time and effort they offer so selflessly.






